A Five Week Study and Experience in Longing For God

"Everyone who drinks of this water will be thirsty again, ¹⁴ but whoever drinks of the water that I will give him will never be thirsty again. The water that I will give him will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life."

- John 4:13-14

Summer is near and that means heat, and heat means thirst! Jesus' words to the woman at the well gave the promise of a life without thirst—a life with the fullness of God. But the world still challenges us and can leave us dry and parched, thirsting for lasting peace, steadfast love, the fullness of grace, and a true and eternal purpose. And so, we embrace Jesus' invitation all the more and we change that for which we crave, that for which we thirst. We thirst for Him! And, we thirst for all that comes with Him—all that defines Him, describes Him, and reveals Him. And as we do, Jesus tells us such a thirst will be quenched!
